Sustainable logging and reforestation are undertaken as income-generating activities.</p>	<p>The integrated project tries to accommodate human needs in a holistic approach. Very often individual projects fail to make connections and therefore spend more time and money addressing only the tip of the iceberg, rather than considering root causes. One of the many examples is MPA.</p> <p>The question to ask is from whom are we protecting the area? The answer, of course, is people. Thus, integrating FP and population projects to the marine-based project is the obvious response. The integrated project operates on the principal of unity.</p>
